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

Program development

Originally proposed in 2004 under National <u>Framework</u> for Energy Efficiency

 Governments recommitted to Program in 2009 under National Strategy on Energy Efficiency







Relationship to other measures

- Increased energy efficiency provisions in Building Code of Australia (commenced May 2010)
- National Building Framework
- HVAC High Efficiency Systems Strategy
- Phasing in commercial building disclosure:
 - > 2010 offices
 - > 2012 other commercial buildings








Why do we need building measures?

Commercial buildings account for ~10% of emissions



'Business as usual'





Why a disclosure Program?

- Enable purchasers and lessees to consider energy efficiency as part of decision-making process
- Help overcome market barriers and promote energy efficient buildings
- Research indicates increasing demand and higher premiums for energy efficient buildings





Who will be impacted by the Program?

- Designers and builders
- Building owners and tenants
- Valuers, real estate agents and lawyers
- Building managers
- Engineers and other technical experts
- Organisations promoting sustainable buildings





What has changed since late 2009?

- Bill tabled in Parliament in March 2010
- Senate enquiry
- Government agreed to a number of amendments:
 - Modifications to the transitional arrangements
 - Reduced penalties for ongoing offences





Timeframes

24 June 2010 Building Energy Efficiency Disclosure Bill 2010

passed by Parliament

1 July 2010 Legislation takes effect

1 Nov 2010 Disclosure obligations commence with

<u>transition period</u> – only NABERS Energy

ratings to be disclosed

1 Nov 2011 Transition period finished - Full BEECs to be

disclosed





Program overview

- Commencing with offices over 2,000 m²
- Disclosure required at point of sale, lease and sublease
- Owners and lessors are required to:
 - register a Building Energy Efficiency Certificate (BEEC); and
 - include the NABERS Energy star rating from the BEEC in any sale, lease or sublease advertisements

BEEC is required at sale or lease

Building >2000m² NLA Multiple tenants <2000m² NLA



BEEC is required at sale only (not lease)

Tenancy lighting assessments

- Conducted by CBD accredited assessors
- Assessment rules currently being finalised
- Scheduled to be available for assessors early 2011
- Provides indicative information on tenancy lighting energy efficiency + lighting controls





What is the energy efficiency guidance?

- Generic not specific to any building
- Suggests opportunities for owners and tenants:
 - Corporate energy policy / action plan
 - Improving skills of building management team
 - > Improvements for HVAC, lighting, etc
 - Increasing staff awareness
 - Green Leases





Enforcement

- Court can order payment of a civil penalty of up to \$110,000 for first day of non-disclosure
- Department can issue infringement notices
- Non-disclosure register listing of people who commit two or more offences in 12 months
- Department will monitor advertisements and transactions
